Socratic discussion, students participate in daily discussions and debates, preparing the mind, body and soul to live prosperously and virtuously in this world.




Academics

Mathematics:

Students are exposed to increasingly more complex mathematical concepts in high school. Ranging from geometry to calculus, the students learn the use of concepts that can carry into real world application, whether it is engineering or accounting. The Montfort's competitive math club bolsters those students who excel at mathematics and want to continue to challenge

Science:

Courses in Bio, Chemistry, and Physics expose the students to the vast world of scientific study and the development of scientific thinking, quantitative research and the data driven evaluation. Montfort is also unique in offering an opportunity to study Astronomy, the original science. Using our high-tech telescopes, including our astronomical observatory on the roof, the students have the opportunity to observe, record and photograph our ever-growing universe.

History:

History begins with people, their actions and the consequences of those actions. Montfort teaches that ideas and people matter and that great ideas influence the course of history. Ideas such as "equality before the law" and "the unexamined life is not worth living". Studying the writings of some of history's greatest men and women, the students debate the parallels between the ancient and modern world. *Courses Offered*

Theology:

Theology is a required course of study for all four years at The Montfort Academy. In asking questions, having doubts and studying our faith, we believe our students' faith will only grow stronger. The students look at the Sacred Scriptures of the Old and New Testament, the History of the Church, the Lives of the Saints and the Church Doctrines. What they study can be applied to real world experiences and aid their struggle in making major life decisions. We strive to bring our students closer to God through study and action in their daily lives. *Courses Offered:*

Theology III – Church History & Doctrinal Theology (11th grade)


Theology IV – Moral Theology & Apologetics (12th grade)



Literature:

Literature portrays the good, the true and the beautiful alongside what is sometimes evil and ugly, providing insight to the reality of humanity. The sequence of novels and books that the students read come from the original Great Books with authors such as Homer, Chaucer, Dante, Shakespeare, Jane Austen and many more. It is literature that reflects the human soul and brings us greater insights into ourselves and our humanity.

Classical Languages:

Classical languages form the foundation on which our students begin their studies here at The Montfort Academy. All 9th grade students are required to take Latin in their first year, therefore, gaining a better understanding of the roots of their own language. Following their 9th grade year, students can decide if they would like to continue the study of classical languages or shift to modern language.

Modern Languages:

After their year of Latin, Montfort's 10th grade students decide between continuing the pursuit of classical languages or beginning their study of Spanish or Italian. Our modern language teachers are native speakers who stress the constant use of their language in the classroom. Students may also have the opportunity to use their language skills on our school trips abroad in Italy and Spain.

Philosophy:

Philosophy is not common in high school curriculum but is a foundational aspect to a Montfort student's education. We challenge the students with some of life's most important questions; life and death, our role in their world, man versus woman and many other ideas that challenged the Ancient Greeks. It is an invitation for our students to explore and challenge these ideas in the classroom and on their own. *Courses Offered:*

The Trivium:

The "lost tools of learning" that all Montfort students take. A sequence of courses that teach them to think, express their thoughts and participate in daily debates. It prepares the students to speak in public and make clear and concise presentations. Our writing program is integrated into these courses to gain practice not only in the spoken word but also in the written word.

Courses Offered: Grammar (9th grade) Logic (10th grade) Debate & Rhetoric (11th grade)




Fine Art:

Admissions

Admission Process for The Montfort Academy:

At The Montfort Academy we take more of a holistic approach to admissions. We want to get to know the students that will join us for the next four years of their lives and make sure it is a good fit for both them and for us! TACHS scores are only a piece of what we look at when admitting a student to Montfort. We also require an online application to be completed and an interview with our Director of Admissions or a member of our staff.

Step 1:

Schedule a Shadow Day and Become a Montfort Knight for a Day! (Available to schedule on our website: www.themontfortacademy.org) Or **attend our Virtual Open House on Tuesday, April 28th from 6:30-7:30 pm.**

Step 2:

<u>Begin your online application.</u> REMEMBER, you must upload a writing sample and student transcripts or report cards. It is *optional* to request letters of recommendation from teachers. For those taking the TACHS Exam, **remember Code 268** for The Montfort Academy.

Step 3:

Begin your financial aid application through **FACTS**, an independent service we use in order to determine financial need for each family.

You will not be able to receive Montfort financial aid unless you fill out this form. Montfort's FACTS code is 36342.

Step 4:

Attend the **Family Interview Day** at The Montfort Academy! Interview day will be announced in the fall or you can schedule another date with Ms. Schenk, Director of Admissions.

Step 5:

Wait for your **Letter of Acceptance**! The letter will be sent on January 13, 2021 by both mail and email.

Tuition & Financial Aid

Tuition:

Tuition for 2020-2021 School Year = \$14,800 Non-refundable Registration Fee = \$1,200 (For Seniors: \$1,400) Total Tuition & Fees = \$16,000 per year

Tuition Payment Plans:

- 1. **Two-payment plan**: the first half of the tuition is due by or before July 1st and the second half is due on or before September 1st.
- 2. **Monthly payment plan**: 10-month payments are offered via an ACH payment plan only. The plan requires a \$50 one-time setup fee and a 5% monthly administration fee.

Scholarship Opportunities:

No additional paperwork is required to be considered for scholarship.

Presidential Scholarships: Full-tuition, half-tuition or quarter-tuition.

- These scholarships may require an additional interview.

Dean's Scholarships: Partial-tuition

Catholic School Scholarship: \$500 discount

- Only applicable to students that attend Catholic Elementary School in the Archdiocese of NY. *Catholic School Employee Scholarship:* \$1,500 discount

• Parent or guardian is an employee of a Catholic elementary school or high school in the Archdiocese of NY.

Sibling Discount:

- An additional discount is offered to families with multiple students attending Montfort at the same time.

15% for 2nd child enrolled

20% for 3rd or more child enrolled

Financial Aid: In order to qualify for financial aid, families must apply to a Private School Aid service or FACTS. (The code for Montfort is 36342) The form must be completed ASAP.
